Guidelines that groups or individuals should follow are:

The primary responsibilities are to fill divots on tees and fairways, and repair ball marks on greens. You should try to do as much as you can to maintain your assigned holes each time you play without impeding the pace of play.

At least once per Month each group or individual should meet before or after normal playing hours and do a thorough job of repair on each Fairway and Green they have responsibility for. Arrangements can be made with Assistant Greens Superintendents Jeff Lebo at Tuscany, and Darren Johnson at Eagle Nest for buckets of sand and seed to support your needs.

The Adopt-A-Hole signs must be placed off the grass for the efficiency of the maintenance crews. They will get dusty and dirty. Each group should use a damp towel and clean their signs as they need it.
