

PCM9GA CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT AND AWARDS DINNER

On 29 March and 5 April 2007 at 1:00 PM at Tuscany Falls, the two halves of the PCM9GA Annual Championship Tournament will be played. The net low 18-hole score will receive a trophy as the 2007 PCM9GA Champion. The low gross score will also receive a trophy. If necessary a playoff will be decided by a putting contest at the end of the 5 April event.

MERLE OATMAN

The tournament will be held annually in memory of Mr. Merle Oatman, who passed away in 2006 and who was the dynamic force that initiated the men's 9 hole group in 2001. As an inspiration to those around him that were not blessed with his natural talents and for his contributions to the world we shared with him, the PCM9GA is honored to dedicate this memorial event to him.

TOURNAMENT

To be eligible to compete for the championship you **MUST HAVE** at least five scores posted in the AGA handicap system. **NO EXCEPTIONS** will be allowed. You may however play in the tournament rounds if you do not have 5 scores posted, but you will not be eligible for the championship. You may also play just one of the two days, again without eligibility for the championship. To play in all or part of the tournament, eligible or not eligible for the championship, there will be a one-time fee of \$10.00 to cover miscellaneous expenses.

Individual score cards with official handicaps will be provided. You must be signed up for tournament participation no later than noon Monday 26 March! Signup sheets will be posted in both pro shops in the week of 12 March.

AWARDS DINNER

One week after the final tournament event, on 12 April at 5:30 PM in the Chianti Room and patio in the Tuscany Falls Clubhouse, the PCM9GA will host an awards dinner/buffet of hamburgers/hot dogs, sides, lemonade and ice tea. It will be preceded by a normal weekly round of nine holes at Tuscany Falls BUT with a 3:00 PM shotgun start. This event is open to ALL PCM9GA members and their wives/significant others, whether playing in the tournament or not, and is funded from the Association treasury. (There will be an open cash bar for those desiring wine or cocktails but beer will be provided with the food at no cost).

Mrs. Oatman and immediate family will be invited to participate in presentation of awards which will precede the dinner itself.

There will be a separate sign up sheet posted in both pro shops for this Awards Dinner (separate from the Tournament sign up sheets). It is essential that you sign up for yourself and guest as early as possible so as to have an accurate head count for Food and Beverage service.

Both the Tournament and Awards Dinner will be the first such events held by the Association. We hope this will start a tradition for many years to come. Please come and help make these successful and pleasant experiences.
