

# Golf Course Dress Code

The PebbleCreek HOA website. [www.pebblecreekhoa.org](http://www.pebblecreekhoa.org), Provides the information on Dress Code for players. Under “Resources”, click on “governing documents”, then click on “rules and regulations”, then go to Section 17- Golf Course Rules and finally 17.7 Dress Code. Even though these rules were slightly revised in October 2008, the Golf Course dress code (including driving range) has never allowed blue jeans. Furthermore each homeowner receives a copy of the PCHOA Rules & Regulations when they move in, so everyone actually does have a copy of the Rules including the golf course dress code. It would be nearly impossible and very unsightly to put signs up throughout the community to inform people of all the applicable rules.

## Here they are:

**17.7 Dress Code.** The following dress code applies to all persons using the golf courses and practice facilities:

- (a) Proper attire: LADIES - Shorts and skorts must be at least mid-thigh in length. Tank tops with minimum 2” shoulder straps and shirts without slogans are permitted. Short shorts, halter tops, tube tops, spaghetti straps, swimwear, or tennis attire are not permitted on the golf courses or practice Blue jeans, blue jean shorts/cutoffs, workout style apparel and flannel sweat pants are not acceptable for either the golf courses or practice facilities.
- (b) Proper attire: MEN - Shorts must be at least mid-thigh in length. Collared shirts, mockturtle necks, and crew-neck shirts with or without name or logo of manufacturer or Golf Club/Country Club and without slogans are permitted. Blue Jeans, blue jean shorts/cutoffs , workout style apparel and flannel sweat pants are not acceptable for either the golf courses or practice facilities.
- (c) Footwear - Golf shoes (soft spikes or spike less), tennis shoes, or rubber-soled shoes must be worn on the golf courses and practice facilities at all times. Any footwear (such as street shoes) that can damage the greens is strictly forbidden.
- (d) Enforcement - The Director of Golf Course Operations, golf course professionals and staffs shall consistently enforce the dress code for the golf courses and practice facilities, and deny access to the facilities to persons not in compliance.
