



Sanford "Sandy" G. Hertz
Passed Away June 4, 2010 after a long battle with cancer.

Sandy and Joy started their life together in Richmond, VA. They were married for 50 years. Sandy's military career took them all over the world with the family ultimately settling in the Washington, DC area.

Sandy served his country for 22 years as a decorated Army officer with two tours of duty in Vietnam and one in Korea. He was the last Battalion Commander to leave Vietnam, having commanded a logistical battalion of over 1,500 men that supported all U.S. forces in the northern most portion of South Vietnam and the Navy's Seventh Fleet. Upon his return home, Sandy served the remainder of his military career in the Department of Defense at the Pentagon. Retiring from his military career as a Lt. Col in 1978, Sandy entered the private sector, and then finally retired from the U.S. Postal Service Headquarters.

Sandy and Joy moved to PebbleCreek in December of 1997 where Sandy involved himself in the Community immediately. In 2004, he was elected to the PCHOA Board of Directors and proudly served for four years. Sandy also served on numerous community and City committees; most notably the PebbleCreek Armed Forces Plaza Committee. Sandy was able to see the project come to fruition and was extremely proud of it's completion.
